Special Exhibition

Pippi Longstocking and the World of Astrid Lindgren Jul. 6, 2019 (Sat)~Aug. 25, 2019(Sun)	This exhibition introduces the literature and the life of Astrid Lindgren, whose archives were added to UNESCO's Memory of the World Register in 2005. Her works are a fine representation of Swedish culture for featuring Swedish way of living, child bearing and coexistence with the nature. This exhibition will be held in commemoration of Japan and Sweden's 150 years of diplomatic relations and showcases valuable object such as original drawings of "Pippi Longstocking".
The Exhibition of SAMURAI Sep. 7, 2019 (Sat)~Nov. 4, 2019(Mon)	Japanese swords and armour often embody the spirit of Japanese artistry. This special display "The Exhibition of SAMURAI" showcases a collection of swords and armour which are a source of great pride in Japan. Traditional Japanese weapons were not viewed merely as battle tools. Captured in each is a masterful display of craftsmanship, refined over the years. This exhibition boasts 150 treasured swords and sets of armour from the 11th to 17th Centuries, and details how they evolved during this turbulent time.
UKIYOE that Challenges Kuniyoshi, Yoshitoshi...and More! Nov. 16, 2019 (Sat)~Dec. 22, 2019(Sun)	This exhibition introduces the artistic talent, vertu and the history of "芳(hou)" family, who consistently tried to evolve the Ukiyoe wood printing method by challenging new techniques. This exhibition especially focuses on Utagawa Kuniyoshi, an artist who was active in the end of the Edo period. It also features Tsukioka Honen, who is claimed to be the last Ukiyoe artist and other disciples of the Honen family. The exhibition includes shocking expressions. Please watch out!

Feature Exhibition Room 1

Intellectual Japanese Women Exhibition 3 Apr. 23, 2019 (Tue)~Jun. 16, 2019(Sun)	This exhibition features the artworks of Futagawa Gyokujo, a female artist of the Fukuoka Clan, and it introduces other female cultural figures resided in Fukuoka from the Bunka to Tempo Period(18th century).
War and Our Way of Living 28 Jun. 18, 2019 (Tue)~Aug. 18, 2019(Sun)	This series of exhibits is being held annually to commemorate "The Day of The Great Fukuoka Air Raid" of June 19, 1945. The 28th edition will introduce how women lived during World War II.
Ancient Swords Aug. 20, 2019 (Tue)~Oct. 20, 2019(Sun)	What swords can tell us is not only the history of battles. They had long been symbols of administrative power and they made their first appearance in Japanese history in the Northern Kyushu area. This exhibition introduces swords from the 10th century BC to the 7th century AC and describes what they meant for people who lived in ancient times.
Newspapers of Modern Fukuoka Oct. 22, 2019 (Tue)~Dec. 22, 2019(Sun)	Newspaper publication started in the Meiji Period and it became indispensable in our daily life. This exhibition introduces some interesting events happening in Fukuoka in the Meiji, Taisho and Showa periods, with articles from local newspapers.
Life at the Fukuoka Castle Town Dec. 24, 2019 (Tue)~Feb. 24, 2020(Mon)	Even during the samurai period, people abided by the rules and paid for daily expenses, just like today. This exhibition explores the way of living of samurai warriors and ordinary folks in the Fukuoka Castle town.
Calligraphy by Master of Tea Ceremony Feb. 26, 2020 (Wed)~Apr. 26, 2020 (Sun)	This exhibition introduces calligraphy drawn by masters of the tea ceremony who lived during the Momoyama period.

Feature Exhibition Room 2

Shini-e "Death Print" May. 8, 2019 (Wed)~Jul 7, 2019(Sun)	Shinie or "Drawing of death" is a genre of ukiyoe which was popular in the late Edo period. It featured celebrities of the time such as famous Kabuki actors. This exhibition displays about 30 death drawings from our museum's collection. Please don't miss it!
Lord of the Kuroda Family, Who Once Prospected to be the Feudal Lord Jul. 9, 2019 (Tue)~Sep. 8, 2019(Sun)	There were some lords of the Kuroda Clan, who were once seen as the successors of the feudal lord but didn't take the opportunity. This exhibition will introduce the reason why they chose not to become the feudal lord, as well as their way of thinking.
Analyzing Portraits Sep. 10, 2019 (Tue)~Nov. 10, 2019(Sun)	What were portraits for? In this exhibition, we will try to find out what motivates people to create self-portraits, by analyzing various portraits in our museum collection.
Samurai of the Edo Period Nov. 12, 2019 (Tue)~Jan 13, 2020(Mon)	The samurai were known to be employed by their lord for their refined skills in military art, but they had other skills, too. This exhibition introduces various duties samurai warriors had in the Edo period.
Poets of Chikushi District Jan. 15, 2020 (Wed)~Mar. 15, 2020 (Sun)	This exhibition introduces some Fukuoka-related poems written in the ancient period.
Drawing of Farming Mar. 17, 2020 (Tue)~May. 17, 2020 (Sun)	The scenery of farming is often depicted in folding screens, and the like. Who drew the pictures of workers and for what purpose? What's more, who displayed those drawings on their walls and for what reason? Let's find out!

Hakata Gion Yamakasa Exhibition 19th Jun. 11, 2019 (Tue)~Aug. 4, 2019 (Sun)	This exhibition introduces the graceful world of Do-yama festive floats (floats with even numbers 2, 4, and 6) together with the rituals and tourist attractions of Hakata, people's way of living, occupations and traditions in the medieval period. It also describes the lives of women of the period by showing some artwork and publications.
Tsutsu-gaki Dying Technique Aug. 6, 2019 (Tue)~Nov. 17, 2019 (Sun)	Tsutsu-gaki is a colorful and auspicious motif which is audaciously printed on dyed navy cloth. Enjoy the beautiful clothes exquisitely dyed by the hands of skilled artists.
Picture Postcard of the Waterside Sceneries of Fishing Nov. 19, 2019 (Tue)~Jan. 26, 2020 (Sun)	This exhibition introduces picture postcards of fishermen at waterside sceneries from the collection of Naoji Kanemori, an enthusiast of angling related documents. How about reminiscing the old days by viewing those post cards?
Electric Weaving Machine Products -Technical Innovation of Hakata Ori Textile- Jan. 28, 2020 (Tue)~Apr. 12, 2020 (Sun)	The weaving machine was introduced for the first time in the Hakata district in the early Showa era. The machine enabled weavers to create textiles without creating patterns. The revolutionary machine could weave any designs out from calligraphy, drawing and photos.
